#4 Presentation of 2022 Audit (Varney and Associates)

April Swartz stated there were no issues or concerns with the 2022 audit. The City of Chapman reports under the Kansas Municipal Audit and Accounting Guide (KMAAG) model which is a cash-basis model. The city's financial statements are fairly stated in all material respects. With the exception of the recreation fund, all funds ended the year with more cash than they started with. The recreation fund has a balance of negative \$177,774.00. There is a plan in place to transfer money over the next couple of years to bring the recreation fund balance to zero. In 2022, the city issued a General Obligation Bond in the amount of \$3,368,000 and the city paid off 2.5 million in temporary notes. At the end of 2022, the city had \$4,390,000 in outstanding bonds.

#5 Discussion on Providing Water to Trailer Court on Quail Road (Mark and Jerry Lovett)

Jerry Lovett requested the city council consider providing water to the trailer parks located west and north of town. The city could also annex the trailer courts and place them in the city limits. There may be grants available to assist with funding. The trailer park north of Interstate 70 has a very large lagoon that could be used if the city needs more lagoon space. Both trailer parks would add approximately 150 people to the city's population. The roads in the trailer parks are blacktop. If the city annexed the trailer parks, the city would be responsible for maintaining the roads.
